of a Prayer for Judgment Continued ("PJC"). For insurance purposes, a driver can only obtain one (1) PJC per household every three (3) years. Thus, if members of a household (collectively) receive more than one (1) PJC every three (3) years, their insurance premiums will likely rise. YMBT only has access to the undersigned's North Carolina driving record. Accordingly, the undersigned agrees to inform YMBT, in writing, if other members of his/her household have received a PJC within the last three (3) years. Absent written notification, YMBT shall rely on the undersigned's North Carolina driving record and assume that no other member of the undersigned's household has received a PJC within the last three (3) years. PJCs may or may not be honored in out-of-state jurisdictions. Those who currently have a commercial driver's license ("CDL"), or were operating a commercial vehicle at the time of the incident, agree to inform YMBT of such, in writing, as the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles ("NCDMV") does not recognize PJCs for these drivers. Unless YMBT received written notification regarding the CDL or commercial vehicle status, YMBT shall assume that the undersigned neither has a CDL nor was operating a commercial vehicle at the time of the incident. Out of State Drivers The attorneys of YMBT are licensed to practice law in the State of North Carolina only. Accordingly, YMBT cannot provide guidance as to how a North Carolina traffic offense will affect an out-of-state licensee. Unless otherwise directed in writing, YMBT will assume that the undersigned has not received other traffic citations in North Carolina during the last three (3) years and will use its best judgment in obtaining a plea arrangement based on North Carolina law, North Carolina insurance guidelines and the Nonresident Violator Compact. YMBT hereby advises all out-of-state licensees to consult with an attorney in their home state regarding how various offenses may affect their driving records and insurance rates.
